

How do I search by tariff code?

This task card demonstrates how to perform a Tariff Code Search within the BICON Web. Goods imported into Australia require classification under the Customs Tariff Act 1995. BICON allows you to use part of the Tariff code or all of the known Tariff code and Statistical Classification to search for Cases.

1. Search for Tariff Code

From the BICON web homepage, select the **Tariff Code** tab.

Enter at least the first 4 digits of an Australian tariff code into the **Tariff Filter** boxes, then select




Entering more digits will provide improved search results.



2. View Results

BICON will present a list of tariff codes that match your search terms.


NOTE: If your search returns No Results Found, reduce the number of digits to be more general.





3. Select Tariff

Once you have found your desired tariff select the Tariff Number.



From here you will be presented with one of three possible outcomes depending on how the tariff is mapped:

- a) **Single Case** If the tariff selected relates to a single case you can select that case and proceed directly to the import conditions questions.
- b) **Multiple Case** If the tariff selected relates to more than one case you will be presented with the list of possible cases and further questions.
- c) **No Case** If the tariff selected is not linked to any case you will receive a notice directing you to use a general search or contact the department.

4. Select Case

If the tariff selected relates to more than one case a list of related cases is present along with questions. You may choose to:

- a) select the appropriate case name from the search results list to proceed in determining your import scenario and view the import conditions.
 OR
- b) answer the questions to reduce the search results to the most relevant case. Select the case name to proceed in determining your import scenario and view the import conditions.

Even if cases are presented, answering the tariff questions may result in no matching case. If this occurs users will be directed to use the **Quick Search**.
