



# How do I view Import Conditions?

This task card demonstrates how to view the import conditions after a Search has been conducted in BICON Web.

## 1. Search and Select a Case

Once you have conducted a search and reviewed the search results, select the case that matches your goods.

**Search Results**

Select an import item that best matches what you want to import to continue the process.

**Non Commodity**  
Please note that the import conditions apply to all packaging, containers and transport methods (non commodity) used to bring goods into the country. These conditions are in addition to the conditions that apply to the goods being imported. You should review this non commodity case.

**Aquaculture including pet fish food**

This case describes the requirements for the importation of aquaculture feed including **pet fish food**. Aquaculture is defined by the Food and Agriculture Organization as: "The farming of aquatic organisms including fish, molluscs, crustaceans and aquatic plants with some sort of intervention in the rearing process to enhance production, such as regular stocking, feeding, protection from predators, etc. Farming also implies individual or corporate ownership of the stock being cultivated." For the import of purified vitamins, purified amino acids, alcohols, citric acid, lactic acid, xanthan gum or [read more](#)

### 3. View Import Conditions

The **Import Conditions** will provide you with the information you need to import your goods, including whether an import permit is required, as well as other documentary requirements.

**Import Conditions**  
The following Import Conditions are applicable to this Import scenario. The Department will assess the suitability of your import against the import conditions.

a. Prior to the importation of goods into Australia, a valid import permit issued by the Department of Agriculture is required.  
An import permit may be obtained by submitting an [import permit application](#) to the department (if viewed online, use the 'Apply Now' button at the bottom of this page).  
You will need to complete the relevant [animal feed checklist](#), as you are asked to provide these details during the permit application.

b. **Conditions of administration**

- The import permit (or number) and all required documentation must accompany each consignment and must be valid at the time the cargo is landed.
- In order to facilitate clearance of mail shipments, the import permit (or number) and all documentation should be securely attached to the outside of the package and marked 'Attention Quarantine'.
- Documents must be provided with each consignment which:
  - identify the consignment e.g. entry number
  - identify all goods being imported as part of this consignment e.g. invoice or waybill or importers manifest
  - describe the goods being imported (where not clear). Example 1: Product X Rab = Purified protein derived from rabbits. Example 2: Product AY =

**C** ! It is the importer's responsibility to provide any additional information which is requested in order to demonstrate that the import permit covers all goods being imported.

c. Under the [Quarantine Service Fees Determination 2005](#), fees are payable to the Department of Agriculture for all services. A list of all [quarantine & export fees](#) is available on the Department of Agriculture's website.

d. Non Commodity requirements for imported Cargo also apply. **B**

**Warnings and Information Notices**

**C** ! Containers, timber packing, pallets or dunnage associated with the consignment will be subject to inspection and treatment on arrival, unless certified as having been treated by a DAFF approved method.

**C** ! All documentation presented to DAFF Biosecurity to assist in determining the level of quarantine risk posed by transportation pathways and packaging must also meet the requirements of the Non-commodity case.
